From her professional career at the detoxification unit, attendance at Alcoholics Anonymous, and Al-Anon meetings she made an impressionable impact on many people's lives. 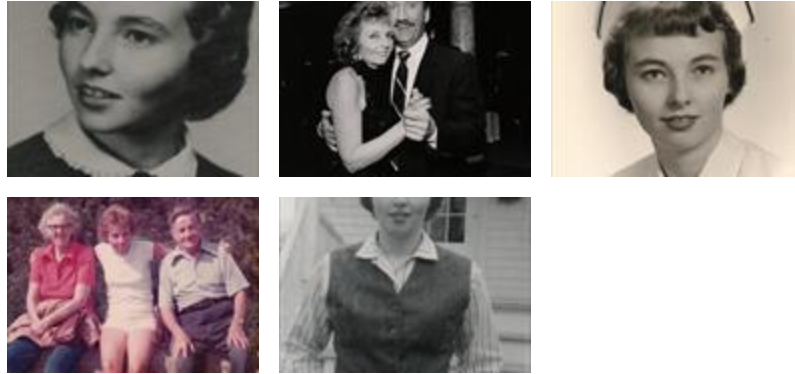
cherished and remembered. She enjoyed being outdoors, had a zest for gardening and a great love for her family.
